

Parish Eucharist Easter 5 28th April 2024

We gather in worship

Please join in all parts of the service printed in bold type. Please stand where indicated only if you wish.

Collection plates are at the back of church if you would like to donate.

Before we begin, the Priest will welcome everyone and invite us to join in prayer as we prepare ourselves for worship.

Almighty God, to whom all hearts are open, all desires known, and from whom no secrets are hidden: cleanse the thoughts of our hearts by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, that we may perfectly love you, and worthily magnify your holy name; through Christ our Lord. Amen.

After praying, please remain quiet until, the bell rings and we stand to sing:

Lord, enthroned in heavenly splendour, first-begotten from the dead, thou alone, our strong defender, liftest up thy people's head.
Alleluia, alleluia,
Jesu, true and living Bread.

Here our humblest homage pay we; here in loving reverence bow; here for faith's discernment pray we, Lest we fail to know thee now. Alleluia, alleluia, thou art here, we ask not how.

Though the lowliest form doth veil thee as of old in Bethlehem, here as there thine angels hail thee, branch and flower of Jesse's stem. Alleluia, alleluia, we in worship join with them.

Paschal Lamb, thine Offering, finished once for all when thou wast slain, in its fullness undiminished shall for evermore remain, Alleluia, alleluia, cleansing souls from every stain.

Life-imparting heavenly manna, stricken rock with streaming side, heaven and earth with loud hosanna worship thee, the Lamb who died, Alleluia, alleluia, risen, ascended, glorified!

The priest invites us to confess our sins, and we say,

Almighty God, our heavenly
Father, we have sinned against you
and against our neighbour in
thought and word and deed,
through negligence, through
weakness, through our own
deliberate fault. We are truly sorry
and repent of all our sins. For the
sake of your Son Jesus Christ, who
died for us, forgive us all that is past
and grant that we may serve you in
newness of life to the glory of your
name. Amen.

The Priest declares the forgiveness of our sin. Then we sing,

we worship you,

Lord Jesus, Christ,
only son of the Father,
Lord God, Lamb of God,
you take away the sin of the world;
have mercy on us;
You are seated at the right hand
of the Father: receive our prayer.

For you alone are the Holy one, You alone are the Lord, You alone are the Most High, Jesus Christ, with the Holy Spirit, in the Glory of God the Father. Glory to God, Glory to God, Glory to God, Glory to God in the highest!

The priest invites us to pray in silence, then says the prayer set for today,

Risen Christ, your wounds declare your love for the world and the wonder of your risen life: give us compassion and courage to risk ourselves for those we serve, to the glory of God the Father. **Amen.**

We listen for God's Word

We sit First Reading: Acts 8.26-40
An angel of the Lord said to Philip, 'Get up and go towards the south to the road that goes down from Jerusalem to Gaza.' (This is a wilderness road.) So he got up and went. Now there was an Ethiopian eunuch, a court official of the Candace, queen of the Ethiopians, in charge of her entire treasury.

He had come to Jerusalem to worship and was returning home; seated in his chariot, he was reading the prophet Isaiah. Then the Spirit said to Philip, 'Go over to this chariot and join it.' So Philip ran up to it and heard him reading the prophet Isaiah. He asked, 'Do you understand what you are reading?' He replied, 'How can I, unless someone guides me?' And he invited Philip to get in and sit beside him. Now the passage of the scripture that he was reading was this: 'Like a sheep he was led to the slaughter, and like a lamb silent before its shearer, so he does not open his mouth. In his humiliation justice was denied him. Who can describe his generation? For his life is taken away from the earth.' The eunuch asked Philip, 'About whom, may I ask you, does the prophet say this, about himself or about someone else?' Then Philip began to speak, and starting with this scripture, he proclaimed to him the good news about Jesus. As they were going along the road, they came to some water; and the eunuch said, 'Look, here is water! What is to prevent me from being baptized?' He commanded the chariot to stop, and both of them, Philip and the eunuch, went down into the water, and Philip baptized him. When they came up out of the water, the Spirit of the Lord snatched Philip away; the eunuch saw him no more,

and went on his way rejoicing. But Philip found himself at Azotus, and as he was passing through the region, he proclaimed the good news to all the towns until he came to Caesarea. This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The cantor leads **Psalm 22.25-31** and we join in the refrain.

Gospel Reading: John 15.1-8

We stand, facing the gospel.

Alleluia..., alleluia...

I am the first and the last, says the Lord, and the living one; I was dead, and behold I am alive for evermore. Alleluia...

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Alleluia, Christ is risen.

He is risen indeed, alleluia!

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.

Glory to you, O Lord.

Jesus said to his disciples: 'I am the true vine, and my Father is the vine-grower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you. Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches.

Those who abide in me and I in them bear much fruit, because apart from

me you can do nothing. Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned. If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My Father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord.

Praise to you, O Christ.

We sit for the **Sermon**, then we keep silence together.

The Creed

We stand to affirm our faith,
We believe in one God, the Father,
the Almighty, maker of heaven and

earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father; through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven, was incarnate from the Holy Spirit and the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On

the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures;

he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again in glory to judge the living and the dead, and his kingdom will have no end.

We believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life, who proceeds from the Father and the Son, who with the Father and the Son is worshipped and glorified, who has spoken through the prophets.

We believe in one holy catholic and apostolic Church. We acknowledge one baptism for the forgiveness of sins. We look for the resurrection of the dead, and the life of the world to come. Amen.

We sit or kneel for the **Prayers of Intercession**

The response in the prayers is Lord, in your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**

and, at the end, Merciful Father, accept these prayers for the sake of your Son, our Saviour Jesus Christ. Amen.

The Peace

Please offer one another a sign of peace with a handshake, warm smile, nod, or bow, and with the words, 'Peace be with you.'

The Offering

We stand to sing as a collection is taken. Please indicate if you wish to make an offering, cash or contactless.

The priest takes the bread and wine and says the prayers of preparation: we respond to each part of the prayer:
Blessed be God forever.

The Eucharistic Prayer

Please remain standing during the Eucharistic Prayer if it is comfortable for you. The priest says,

The Lord is here;
God's Spirit is with us.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

The priest praises God and we sing,

Holy, holy, holy Lord,
 God of power and might,
 heaven and earth are full of your
 glory. Hosanna, hosanna,
 hosanna in the highest.
 Blessed is he who comes in the name
 of the Lord. Hosanna, hosanna,
 hosanna in the highest.

The priest continues, recalling the Last Supper, then the Deacon says,

Great is the mystery of faith

♪ Christ has died; Christ is risen; Christ will come again.

The priest continues ending with

...forever and ever.

♪ Amen, amen, amen.

As our Saviour taught, so we pray:

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as in heaven.

Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our sins as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power, and the glory are yours now and for ever. Amen.

Breaking the bread

We break this bread to share in the body of Christ. Though we are many, we are one body, because we all share in one bread.

We share in Communion

Alleluia. Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

Please come to the front and form a queue. Communion will be offered in both kinds, on the hand and from the chalice (optional). Please do not intinct (dip) the wafer in the chalice.

Communion will be brought to those seated in the south aisle.

The choir sings the anthem,

Christ Rising Again -Thomas Tallis (1505 – 1585)

We keep silence together.

The priest says this prayer,

Amen. Almighty God, we thank you for feeding us with the body and blood of your Son Jesus Christ. Through him we offer you our souls and bodies to be a living sacrifice. Send us out in the power of your Spirit to live and work to your praise and glory. Amen.

Notices may be given. We may hear from the children.
