The Greeting

The priest introduces the day's liturgy:

Dear friends, forty days ago we celebrated the birth of our Lord Jesus Christ. Now we recall the day on which he was presented in the Temple, when he was offered to the Father and shown to his people. As a sign of his coming among us, his mother was purified, as we now come to him for cleansing. In their old age Simeon and Anna recognized him as their Lord, as we today sing of his glory. In this Eucharist, we celebrate both the joy of his coming and his searching judgement, looking back to the day of his birth and forward to the coming days of his passion.

The priest says the Collect, the special prayer for the day.

We listen for God's Word

We sit for the Reading: Hebrews 2.14-18

Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death – that is, the devil – and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death. For surely it is not angels he helps, but Abraham's descendants. For this reason he had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted.

This is the word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.

The Gospel: Luke 2.22-40

Alleluia...

Speak Lord, we listen, speak your words of wisdom that we may receive the words that give life, life for the world.

We turn to face the reader.

The Lord be with you. And also with you.

Hear the Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Luke: Glory to you, O Lord.

When the time came for their purification according to the law of Moses, Mary and Joseph brought Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord. (as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every firstborn male shall be designated as holy to the Lord'), and they offered a sacrifice according to what is stated in the law of the Lord, 'a pair of turtle-doves or two young pigeons.'

Now there was a man in Jerusalem whose name was Simeon; this man was righteous and devout, looking forward to the consolation of Israel, and the Holy Spirit rested on him. It had been revealed to him by the Holy Spirit that he would not see death before he had seen the Lord's Messiah. Guided by the Spirit, Simeon came into the temple; and when the parents brought in the child Jesus, to do for him what was customary under the law, Simeon took him in his arms and praised God, saying,

'Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles and for glory to your people Israel.'

And the child's father and mother were amazed at what was being said about him. Then Simeon blessed them and said to his mother Mary, 'This child is destined for the falling and the rising of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be opposed so that the inner thoughts of many will be revealed – and a sword will pierce your own soul too.'

When they had finished everything required by the law of the Lord, they returned to Galilee, to their own town of Nazareth. The child grew and became strong, filled with wisdom; and the favour of God was upon him.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, O Christ.

The Liturgy of Baptism

Presentation of the Candidates

The deacon lights the Paschal candle. Amaiyah, her parents and godparents come to the front. The congregation remains seated. The priest addresses the whole congregation,

Jesus said, 'Let the children come to me. Do not stop them'. We thank God for Amaiyah who has come to be baptized today. Christ loves her and welcomes her into his Church.

Will you support her on his journey of faith? We will.

Will you help her to live and grow within God's family? We will.

The priest then asks the parents and godparents

God knows each of us by name and we are his. Parents and godparents, you speak for Amaiyah today. Will you pray for her and help her to follow Christ? **We will.**

The Decision

The priest addresses Amaiyah's parents and godparents. We all join in the responses

We all wander far from God and lose our way: Christ comes to find us and welcomes us home. In baptism we respond to his call. Therefore I ask:

Do you turn away from sin? I do. Do you reject evil? I do.

Do you turn to Christ as Saviour? I do. Do you trust in him as Lord? I do.

We are assured of God's forgiving love.

Signing with the Cross

The priest marks Amaiyah with the sign of the cross using holy oil, saying,

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of his cross.

When Amaiyah has been signed with the cross, the priest says,

Do not be ashamed of Christ. You are his for ever. Stand bravely with him against all the powers of evil, and remain faithful to Christ to the end of your life.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen.**

The baptism party gathers round the font.

Prayer over the Water

Praise God who made heaven and earth, who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. It is right to give thanks and praise.

We praise you, loving Father, for the gift of your Son Jesus. He was baptized in the River Jordan, where your Spirit came upon him and revealed him as the Son you love. He sent his followers to baptize all who turn to him. Now, Father, we ask you to bless this water, that those who are baptized in

it may be cleansed in the water of life, and, filled with your Spirit, may know that they are loved as your children, safe in Christ for ever. **Amen.**

We affirm our faith.

Do you believe and trust in God the Father, who made all things? We believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Son Jesus Christ, who redeemed the world? We believe and trust in him.

Do you believe and trust in his Holy Spirit, who gives life to the people of God? We believe and trust in him.

This is the faith of the Church.

This is our faith. We believe and trust in one God:
Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Amen.

The Peace

Christ is our peace. If anyone is in Christ, there is a new creation. The old has passed away: behold, everything has become new.

The deacon says,

Please offer one another a sign of peace with a handshake, warm smile, nod, or bow, and with the words, 'Peace be with you.'

During the offertory hymn, the baptism party return to the front; then the plate and card reader will be available for contactless and cash donations.

The priest takes the bread and wine and says the prayer of preparation.

The priest continues, recalling the Last Supper.

The Deacon says, Great is the mystery of faith We sing,

Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again. Christ has died: Christ is risen: Christ will come again.

The priest continues, ending ... for ever and ever

Amen.

We sit or kneel. We say together the Lord's prayer,

Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, your will be done on earth as in heaven. Give us today our daily bread.
Forgive us our sins, as we forgive those who sin against us. Lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours, now and forever. Amen.

The priest breaks the consecrated bread and says,

We break the bread of life, and that life is the light of the world. God here among us, light in the midst of us, bring us to light and life.

We sing,

We share in Communion

The priest says,

God's holy gifts for God's holy people. Jesus Christ is holy, Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

The people receive communion. Those who do not wish to receive are warmly invited to come forward for an individual blessing. Gluten free wafers are available.

Please come to the front and form a queue. Communion will be administered in both kinds, on the hand and from the chalice (optional). Please do not intinct (dip) the wafer in the chalice.

Communion will be brought to those seated in the south aisle.

Blessed candles will be available to collect after receiving communion.

During the Communion we sing,

Christ's is the world in which we move; Christ's are the folk we're summoned to love; Christ's is the voice which calls us to care, and Christ is the one who meets us here.

To the lost Christ shows his face, to the unloved he gives his embrace, to those who cry in pain or disgrace, Christ makes, with his friends, a touching place.

Feel for the people we most avoid – strange or bereaved or never employed. Feel for the women and feel for the men who fear that their living is all in vain.

Feel for the lives by life confused, riddled with doubt, in loving abused; feel for the lonely heart, conscious of sin, which longs to be pure but fears to begin.

O Christ, the light who came to us on earth, shine through the shadow cast by human sin; renew the faith you gave at our new birth, destroy the dark, and let your light come in.
