



Safeguarding Children and Adults at Risk Policy

As a community of faith, we consider the safeguarding of children and adults who cannot protect themselves to be a key part of our mission and ministry. As such, we will always respond to any concerns in compliance with UK statute and guidance.

As part of the Diocese of Oxford, we abide by the guidelines laid out in the Diocesan Safeguarding Handbook. This short policy document should be read in the context of these Diocesan guidelines.

A safeguarding concern is any situation where a parishioner or other person has reason to believe that:

- a child may be being abused emotionally, physically, sexually, spiritually or neglected,
- a vulnerable adult may be being abused emotionally, physically, sexually, financially, spiritually or neglected, and may not be able to protect themselves.

For definitions of a child, an adult at risk, abuse or neglect, refer to the Diocesan Safeguarding Handbook.

In the event of witnessing behaviour which causes you concern (including the behaviour of an adult towards a child or an adult who cannot protect themselves, or if a child or adult informs you of something which causes you concern, you should immediately contact by telephone a member of the Safeguarding Team:

Do not share concerns by email, and do not share with anyone outside the Safeguarding Team.

The Safeguarding Team will keep a record of the discussion, in line with Data Protection legislation. In consultation with the safeguarding team, a decision will be made as to what further action (if any) is appropriate, including referral to the Diocesan safeguarding team and/or other agencies where relevant.

If you provide a service on behalf of the Church, please ensure you have read and signed the Code of Conduct

Please be aware of any additional vulnerabilities e.g. disability (including learning disability), young people at risk of criminal exploitation (including sexual exploitation), domestic abuse, mental health problems, homelessness, substance and alcohol misuse, at risk of radicalisation.

Both adults and children may be at risk of trafficking, modern day slavery, forced marriage and FGM, it is important to be aware of the groups most at risk and those from communities that practise FGM.

Children or vulnerable adults may ask you not to tell anybody about what they disclose to you. Do not promise to keep it a secret. Explain that you will only tell the people who need to know in order to keep them and others safe.

The policy of All Saints is to request DBS clearance for adults providing regulated activity services (please see Diocesan Safeguarding Handbook) to children and adults who may not be able to protect themselves.

In using mobile phones, email or social media to communicate with children and young people or vulnerable adults, please be aware of the guidelines laid out in the Diocesan Safeguarding Handbook.
